Due to the spread of a western type diet diabetes in adults is a growing problem in many parts of the world, including in rural communities in South Africa. But the eye clinic on Phelophepa cannot help them. How long will it be for treatments for chronic eye conditions such as diabetic retinopathy reach these people who wait so long just to be fitted with spectacles for short-sightedness? The Phelophepa health train only comes through Thaba Nchu every two years. Without optometrists opening clinics in this area it's the only source of eye care for half a million people.
