SCENE 1

Katie:

I'd quite like to discuss our podcast.

Neil:

What d'you mean 'our'?

Donna:

I'm sorry, Neil. This was my fault. Katie and I were thinking of doing a podcast.

Neil:

So was I. Rob says I've got very good verbal skills.

Katie:

Who's Rob?

Neil:

He's just someone who helps me with my work.

Donna:

Katie:

Katie

Donna:

You can finish your coffee at least.

Neil:

Hello.

Jade starts to cry (Crying sound)

Neil:

Katie:
