The front is Roman classical, and clad in rich Istrian stone. The back of the church as seen from the private meditational space of the cloisters is entirely different. We would hardly recognise it as the same church. The brick construction of the building is not concealed. Even more striking the towers flanking the dome appear like eastern minarets.

In building the Redentore, Palladio seems to have drawn inspiration from two separate traditions.
